JOB DESCRIPTION**

JOB TITLE: Class I Application Technician

LENGTH OF WORK: 260 days / year

JOB GOALS: Maintain technology equipment and assist staff in its use.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

1. Maintain and support the student management system (SASI/xp), which also includes add-on products from MEG such as MSE Fees, MSE Student Alert, MSE Hot Lunch, ISR and letter generation applications.
2. Work with teachers and staff to maintain and support the InteGrade Professional Grade Book Application.
3. Coordinate and assist school personnel with data collection for all required Indiana Department of Education reports submitted via the STN Application Center.
4. Export data from SASI/xp to applications such as Cafeteria Management Systems, managed student applications (i.e. Cornerstone) and other applications as necessary.
5. Import school pictures into applications such as SASI/xp, Cafeteria Management Systems and Library Management systems.
6. Provide user level support for corporate standard applications such as Microsoft Office Professional Suite, Palm Personal Management software and the GroupWise system
7. Responsible for maintaining user accounts and setting security levels for access to Novell network, GroupWise and SASI/xp.
8. Conduct training sessions for such applications as GroupWise, InteGrade and Microsoft Office Products.
9. Backup Technology Department Secretary when needed.
10. Assist in other projects assigned by the Technology Director.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential function satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability

required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE:

High school diploma or general education degree (GED) plus extensive computer knowledge; or one to three years related experience and/or training; or equivalent combination of education and experience.

LANGUAGE SKILLS:

Ability to read and interpret documents such as safety rules, operating and maintenance instructions, and procedure manuals. Ability to write routine reports and correspondence. Ability to speak effectively before groups of children, parents, or employees of the school organization.

CERTIFICATES, LICENSES, REGISTRATIONS:

Valid state driver's license - operator permit, Novel, CNA, Microsoft MCP or A+ Certification

MATHEMATICAL SKILL:

Ability to add, subtract, multiply, and divide in all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions, and decimals. Ability to apply concepts such as fractions, percentages, ratios, and proportions to practical situations.

REASONING ABILITY:

Ability to solve practical problems and deal with a variety of concrete variables in situations where only limited standardization exists. Ability to interpret a variety of instructions furnished in written, oral, diagram, or schedule form.

OTHER SKILLS and ABILITIES:

The employee should be able to use the following machines, tools, equipment, and work aids which may be representative, but not all inclusive, of those commonly associated with this type of work: pen, pencil, pointer, slate, stylus, projector, public address system, tape recorder, blackboard, chalk, charts, diagrams, examinations, manuals, maps, publications, reference books, textbooks, computers.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:
